the most far-reaching agreement on environment and sustainable development ever adopted. The Kyoto Protocol entered into effect on February 16, 2005.

People can help reduce global warming by recycling, buying hybrid cars, or driving smaller cars which use less gas. Our world is facing extinction, but we can still prevent it, and save future generations. While scientists are working hard to create a new source of energy and find a way to prevent further damage, we use every opportunity to help and we must contribute!
